

## Alcohol and Drug Education When to Get Urgent Help

## CALL 911 or go to the nearest emergency room for these symptoms, as any of them can lead to death.



People using any substance that contains or could be contaminated with opioids should have naloxone (e.g., Narcan<sup>®</sup>) on hand.

## **ALCOHOL** DRUGS Confusion, trouble breathing, Shallow breathing, slow vomiting, clammy skin, low heart rate, blue lips or OPIOID ALCOHOL heart rate, low temperature, nails, unresponsiveness, **OVERDOSE OVERDOSE** seizures, unconsciousness, and clammy skin. Nausea, headache, severe Agitation, chest pain, sweating, shaking, anxiety, nausea, vomiting, rapid **STIMULANT** ALCOHOL sensory disturbances. breathing, and heart rate. **OVERDOSE WITHDRAWAL** Occurs 2-3 days after heavy Overdose: slowed or drinkers stop abruptly: stopped breathing, confusion, shaking, rapid confusion, weak pulse. heartbeat, hallucinations -DELIRIUM BARBITURATE Withdrawal: sweating, TREMENS OVERDOSE/ seek treatment to avoid anxiety, seizures, WITHDRAWAL (DTs) heart attack or seizure. circulatory failure. Seizures and delirium tremens (DTs). See DT **BENZO**information under Alcohol. DIAZEPINE WITHDRAWAL



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
